When does your child move sections?

Group Membership Coordinator, Jackie explains the process

Each section moves up at a certain age, joining the next section after the relevant half term. We work to the same term dates as York's school calendar, although we allow an extra week after the Summer and Christmas holidays: -

What is the process?

Jackie will send an email via OSM towards the end of the term before your child is old enough to move up. Sometimes where birthdays fall in term time you may be invited to move up the term before or after they become old enough to join. If in doubt, please feel free to contact Jackie.

Her email will ask you to share your meeting preferences via a link to a form or response email. Having more than one preference helps us allocate quicker. However, we know how busy your children's evenings can be and the juggle faced to fit in activities. This can result in some nights being more popular and waiting lists forming.

If you have to join a waiting list, we will contact you when your child reaches the top. If you can join another meeting night until your first preference becomes available this will mean they are not missing out on Scouting.

Over the half term before your child moves up you will receive an email welcoming you to your new section, details about uniform and how to contact your new leader.

The first month in your new section is subs free to ensure they're enjoying it before committing to join. You can also join our Uniform Exchange Facebook page to see if your new uniform is available for free from others moving up.

If you'd like to move meeting nights, please speak with your Section Leader as first point of contact.

1st Holgate Clothing Range

We've been working away over the last few months to design our new group clothing range! For those of you that have been around at 1st Holgate for a while you'll know that we've previously designed t-shirts for our whole group camps, these have been a big success so we wanted to take this a step further and give you something just for 1st Holgate that we can wear on our slightly less formal activities, camps and events.

Please note this doesn't replace our official Scouting uniforms (which should continue to be worn to weekly section meetings) but you could always wear a t-shirt under your Beaver jumper or Scout shirt (perfect for the warmer weather!) This clothing is open to all members and supporters of the Scout Group whether you're a young person, section volunteer, support team member or parent helper!

Items available include hoodies, t-shirts, polo shirts, full zip fleeces and softshell body warmers - see the images opposite for a guide as to what is available! All are available in a range of kids and adults sizes (except the bodywarmers - adult sizes only).

Our clothing is being provided through Edge Clothing, a Scarborough based company that provide clothing to many Scout groups in the area. You can buy directly through their website: https://bit.ly/3VpBaMN but you will have to pay £7 delivery per order.

We have recently made a bulk order and this is available for collection now. If you would like to place an order, the delivery is £7, we would recommend linking with others to share the cost as unfortunately we will not be able to place a bulk order again until next year due to the extra pressures it places on our volunteers.
